ANNUAL JBBA NATIONAL JUNIOR HEIFER SHOW RULES HEART O' TEXAS FAIRGROUNDS WACO, TEXAS JULY 19-24, 2010

Qualifications of Exhibitor

- 1. Must be a member of the Junior Beefmaster Breeders Association (JBBA).
- 2. Must register for Convention and pay fees. (All fees are non-refundable.)
- 3. Each exhibitor should have continually and personally fed and cared for their heifer(s) under the direct supervision of a County Agent, Vo-Ag instructor and/or his or her parents.
- 4. Entries must be exhibited by the owner unless he or she owns two or more entries in the same class, whereupon another bona fide JBBA exhibitor may show one of the entries. If the entry is a pair, the cow must be exhibited by the owner.
- 5. Any JBBA exhibitor who is a qualified entrant to show and cannot, due to illness or injury while attending the show, may have their entry shown by another bona fide JBBA exhibitor.
- 6. Exhibitors must be a minimum of six years old on January 1st of the year of the show.

Dog Rule

If at any JBBA event, a dog or personal pet is considered a problem, disruption, and/or not properly controlled or handled by the owner or person responsible for said animal, a JBBA director, adult advisory committee person, or show official can be notified and in response to notification, have the authority to request that said dog or personal pet be immediately removed from the premises. If you have dogs or personal pets that travel with you, please be considerate of other exhibitors and their cattle.

Qualifications of Heifer

- 1. Official Interstate Health Certificates must accompany all cattle and must be presented to a representative of the show at the time the cattle arrive on the show premises. Each heifer must be tested for T.B. and Brucellosis in accordance with federal and state regulations. Such tests must be made by a federally accredited laboratory. THIS SHOW IS AN INTERSTATE (ACCEPTING ANIMALS FROM OTHER STATES) SHOW FOR LIVESTOCK ENTRIES. EXHIBITORS WITH LIVESTOCK ORIGINATING OUTSIDE THE STATE OF TEXAS ARE ENCOURAGED TO CONTACT THEIR STATE ANIMAL HEALTH OFFICIALS TO CONFIRM SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS, IF ANY; THEIR STATE MAY IMPOSE ON ANIMALS RETURNING FROM A TEXAS SHOW.
- 2. Original BBU Certificates of Breeding (not copies) on each animal shown, including any calf-at-side, must be presented to a representative of the show at the time the cattle arrive on the premises. Application for a BBU Certificate of Breeding on calves under 30 days of age must be presented. Official scramble registration papers with appropriate show stamp must be presented at check-in.

Qualifications of Heifer Cont'd...

- 3. All heifers must be registered with Beefmaster Breeders United as a purebred and out of a BBU-Certified Purebred dam, Second Cross dam or as otherwise stated in the BBU By-Laws.
- 4. All heifers shall be inspected to ensure that all identification numbers and holding brands branded or tattooed on the animal and the description match identically with the BBU Certificate of Breeding.
- 5. All heifers must have been owned by the entrant a minimum of 60 days prior to the show, May 25, 2010. Evidence of ownership is indicated by the date of sale on the registration certificate.
- 7. Joint ownership, when both owners are JBBA members, will be accepted. However, an animal(s) must be entered and exhibited in the name of one of the owners. Joint ownership consisting of parent-youth or a combination of adult and youth will not be eligible.
- 7. There is no limit to the number of heifers an exhibitor may enter.
- 8. Heifers that do not show the day of month of birth on their BBU Certificate of Breeding shall be considered to be born on the first day of that month.
- 9. All Animals will be shown with their hair coats laying flat against their entire body. Hair trimming is permissible. Those few areas such as the legs, tailhead and portions of the topline of the animal which may not naturally lay flat against the body must be trimmed to be flush with adjacent portions of the hair coat. Hair may not be trained or pulled upwards or forwards. Animals will not be shown that have any foreign object(s) attached to it in any manner nor will animals be allowed to be shown that have their natural color altered in a manner so as to change the conformation or appearance. Exhibitors failing to abide by this rule will be dismissed from the arena and/or forfeit premiums, awards and points won by same exhibitors.
- 10. Any heifer that, in the opinion of the designated BBU official, would be a detriment to the breed shall be removed from the show, regardless of any prior classification. Examples would be heifers exhibiting signs of low fertility, genetic or physical defects.
- 11. Any uncontrollable heifer will be dismissed from the ring at the discretion of the judge or show official/coordinator.
- 12. Substitutions will be allowed up to **July 22, 2010**, **9:00 a.m.**, provided the substitution animal meets all other requirements and rules. There will be a substitution fee of \$25 per animal.
- 13. To be eligible for Bred and Owned Show awards, *exhibitors must present an original Bred-and-Owned certificate at time of check-in*. Bred-and-Owned certificates may be obtained by contacting the BBU office and providing the registration number. Joint ownership, when both members are the breeder of record, will be accepted.

Qualifications of Heifer Cont'd...

- 14. All heifers, two (2) years and older on the day of the show must be palpated safe in calf by a licensed veterinarian and so state on the health certificate, with the exception of heifers nursing their BBU registered natural calf-at-side (under 6 months of age), in which case the heifer may show open. Heifers that do not show the day of month on their BBU Certificate of Breeding shall be considered to be born on the first day of that month.
- 15. A class may be split at the discretion of the show official/coordinator. Every effort will be made to split classes on a monthly basis.
- 16. Heifers two (2) years and older on the day shown whose calf has died cannot be shown.
- 17. **Pair Classes: To be eligible to show in the pair classes, all heifers MUST HAVE BBU registered haltered calf at side.

19. **Bred-and-Owned Heifer Show**

- A. Heifer(s) must be entered in the National Show to compete (Cannot only enter Bred-and- Owned Show).
- B. All heifers must have Bred-and-Owned certificate. To be eligible for the Bred-and-Owned Show awards, *exhibitors must present an original Bred-and-Owned certificate at time of check-in*. Bred-and-Owned certificates may be obtained by contacting the BBU office and providing the registration number. Owners of Bred-and-Owned animals are defined as follows:
 - 1. Breeder- That individual, corporation or firm who owned the dam at the time of conception of the animal in question.
 - 2. Owner That individual, corporation or firm who owned the dam at the time of birth of the animal in question.
- C. You may enter as many heifers as you want (no limit).
- D. \$10 entry fee per animal (Late fee \$20 per animal).
- E. Not a mandatory show but, must enter at least one heifer in order to get points for Bred- and-Owned in All-Around competition.

A. The exhibitor of the Champion Bred-and-Owned Heifer will have his/her name placed on the Bred-and-Owned trophy which will be kept in the possession of the winner until the next year's National Junior Heifer Show. An individual who has the Champion Bred-and-

Bred-and-Owned Heifer Show Cont'd....

Owned at the National Junior Heifer Show three (3) times will retire the trophy. In addition, the exhibitor of the Champion Bred-and-Owned Heifer will be eligible for an accumulating cash award if the heifer is a product of the JBBA A. I. Program. The cash award will be in the amount of \$100 with an additional \$100 added each year until the award is won, at which time it will start over the next year at \$100.

B. The exhibitor of the Champion Bred-and-Owned Heifer will also receive a semen tank and one (1) free registration for Bovine Elite, Inc.'s A. I. Management School, during the 2009-2010 calendar year. The Reserve Champion Bred-and-Owned exhibitor winner will receive one (1) free registration for Bovine Elite Inc.'s A. I. Management School during the 2009-2010 calendar year.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Entry deadline for heifers is JUNE 11, 2010.

All Entries and Pre-Registrations must be received at the JBBA office no later than this date or you will pay the late animal entry & convention registration fees.

THIS WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED WITH NO EXCEPTIONS!

- All applications for entry must be submitted on official JBBA forms in accordance with instructions for same.
- 3. All protests must be filed by July 24, 2010, 5:00 p.m. with a \$100 fee. If the protest is upheld, the \$100 fee will be refunded. All protests will be reviewed and resolved by the BBU Junior Program Committee and Junior Board members available.
- 4. Failure to comply with these rules or failure to cooperate with the show and breed officials will be grounds for removal.
- 5. All heifers must be in place and checked in by show officials by 9:00 a.m., July 22, 2010.
- 6. All heifers will be released at 6:00 p.m. on July 24, 2010 and must be off of show grounds by 11:00 a.m. on July 25, 2010. Owners of animals not removed by 11:00 a.m. on July 25, 2010 will be fined \$50 per animal.
- 7. Substitutions will be allowed up to **July 22, 2010, 9:00 a.m.**, provided the substitution animal meets all other requirements and rules. There will be a substitution fee of \$25 per animal.
- 8. All exhibitors are encouraged to bring a wheelbarrow to help contain waste.
- 9. Tie space is soil & cement. Shavings must be purchased from the Heart O' Texas Fairgrounds (\$6 \$9)
- 10. NURSE COWS, RECIPIENT COWS, RETIRED SHOW HEIFERS WITH CALVES, ETC., WILL NOT BE ALLOWED ON THE SHOW GROUNDS. THE ONLY COWS ALLOWED ON THE SHOW GROUNDS WILL BE THOSE ENTERED IN A CLASS THEMSELVES. BULLS ENTERED IN THE BULL BONANZA WILL BE IN AN AREA, TO BE DESIGNATED UPON ARRIVAL, PROVIDED THE JBBA MEMBER HAS PAID THE ENTRY FEE(S), WITH THE OWNER RESPONSIBLE FOR CARE OF HIS/HER ENTRY.

All contestants shall be broken into three divisions for the Contests. The Junior Division shall be those who are 10 years of age and younger as of January 1, 2010. The Intermediate Division shall be those between the ages of 11 and 14 as of January 1, 2010. The Senior Division shall be those who are 15 years of age and older as of January 1, 2010.

11. Points shall be awarded as follows for **All Contests**, except Heifer Show and Bred-and-Owned Show.

12. The judge shall be selected by the Junior Activities Director and the Executive Vice-President of BBU from the official JBBA Approved Judges List. National judges shall not have judged at the National Junior Heifer Show within the past 3 years or at a Class C show within the past year.

I. SHOWMANSHIP CONTEST

To be eligible for the Showmanship Contest the contestant must be entered in the National Junior Heifer Show and meet all rules for same. The entry fee for the showmanship contest is \$5.00 per contestant.

Each contestant must wear the exhibitor number for the heifer they are showing.

II. JUDGING CONTEST

The keep-cull class will consist of eight cattle, four of which are to be selected to "keep" and four are to be "culled" or rejected based on visual appraisal.

While the contest is in progress, there shall be no conferring between contestants or parents. Any violation of this rule will result in the disqualification of the contestant.

Non-JBBA members are invited to participate in this contest but will not be eligible for official placings in the JBBA divisions.

III. HERDSMANSHIP AWARD

The Herdsmanship Award is based on the appearance and neatness of the exhibitors stall and heifer(s). Participation, conduct and attitude will also be considered.

IV. HERDSMAN QUIZ

There will be three tests, one for Juniors, one for Intermediates and one for Seniors. Those Juniors and Intermediates wanting study materials can contact the BBU office. The Senior Division test will consist of questions taken from the BBU brochures, the Beef Improvement Federation (BIF) Handbook and 2010 BBU Spring Sire Summary. Those Seniors wanting this information can contact the BBU office.

V. LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE

A two hour Leadership/Personal Development Conference will be held Tuesday, July 20, for Intermediate and Senior participants only. Anyone wanting to run for a JBBA Board position MUST attend this conference. Any Intermediate or Senior member may attend the Conference even if they do not seek Board election. 50 points towards the All-Around scores will be awarded for attending the entire Conference. Board candidates will be interviewed on Wednesday, July 21, 2010 at 8:00 a.m. Reminder: All those seeking a board position must submit a director's application. If you are elected you must be prepared to raise a minimum of \$650 in sponsor money for the following year's nationals and will have to purchase a director's shirt and official uniform. All applicants must attend the JBBA Board Meeting held on Tuesday, July 20, 2010. Contact the JBBA office for applications.

VI. <u>PUBLIC SPEAKING CONTEST</u> (The public is invited to attend.)

Rules for all Divisions: Senior & Intermediate Contestants will be required to bring three copies of a typewritten double spaced copies of their speech (with bibliography) on $8 \frac{1}{2} X 11$ white paper to contest check in. Junior Contestants are required to bring two copies of typewritten double spaced copies of their speech on an $8 \frac{1}{2} x 11$ white paper to contest check in.

1st Place winners in each age division will give their speech at the Awards Banquet, on Saturday night.

The time limit will be 3-5 minutes for Intermediates and Seniors.

The time limit will be 2-4 minutes for Juniors.

No visual aids.

No props.

Notes are acceptable, but the speech is not to be read from notes.

Each judge will be allowed to ask questions after a speech is given and contestants will be scored on their ability to answer the questions. After each contestant has made his/her presentation, they will be scored on communication, introduction, body, time and conclusion.

2010 National JBBA Steer Show Rules

SUPERINTENDENT: BBU FIELD SERVICE REPRESENTATIVES

Steers must be registered Beefmaster or Beefmaster Advancer animals. Steers must be owned by the JBBA member before April 1, 2010.

Steers must be born between January 1, 2009 and December 31, 2009 and weigh a minimum of 900 pounds on July 29, 2010. Any steer weighing less than 900 pounds will be shown in a prospect steer show but will not be eligible for overall awards.

Steers will be weighed and scanned (ultrasounded) for carcass data collection (fat thickness, ribeye area and intramuscular fat) at 9:00 a.m., Thursday, July 22, 2010.

All JBBA rules regarding fitting, hair length, etc. will apply to the steer show.

Steers must be shown on halter in the live animal show and ultrasounded to receive awards.

Awards to be Presented:

Live Animal Show Champion Live Animal Show Reserve Champion Ultrasound Carcass Champion Ultrasound Carcass Reserve Champion Overall Champion Overall Reserve Champion

Written Exam Score - Accounting for 20% of the total score.

Each exhibitor will complete a 20 question written exam involving selection, feeding, showing, yield grading, quality grading, etc. of their steer project. Exhibitors will be ranked/placed from highest to lowest test scores. Individual questions will be used to break ties for the final ranking.

Live Animal Show Placing – Accounting for 30% of the total score.

Steers will be divided into and shown in three weight (light, medium and heavy) classes as equally as possible. The steer judge will place individuals in their respective class as well as an overall ranking.

Ultrasound Carcass Results - Accounting for 50% of the total score.

All carcass data will be generated from ultrasound measurements taken by a qualified ultrasound technician. **NO** animals will be harvested for carcass data collection. Carcass data will be derived from the ultrasound measurements by initially ranking the steers using the USDA Yield Grade

Equation: USDA YG = 2.5 + (2.5 x fat thickness + (0.2 x estimated %KPH Fat (2.5%)) - (0.32 x ribeye area) + (0.0038 x hot carcass weight (assume 62% of Live weight).

The numerical yield grade derived from this formula will then be adjusted for ultrasonic ribeye area (REAU), ultrasonic fat thickness (FTU), hot carcass weight (HCW) and ultrasonic quality grade (%FATU) using the following adjustment factors for the final BEEF CARCASS INDEX (BCI) to determine Champion and Reserve Champion Beef Carcass. The lowest BCI animal will win.

The overall champion and reserve champion will be determined by the lowest final score tabulated as follows: (exam score ranking X 0.20) + (live animal show ranking X 0.30) + (BCI ranking X 0.50). Tabulated final score ties will be broken by using the following values (listed in order of priority): PYG, QG, exam score and/or live animal ranking.

Haltered Bull Show

For the Bull to eligible, he must be:

- Born from March 31, 2010-September 1, 2008
- Haltered & Broke to Lead
- Bred & Owned by the exhibitor

Additional Rules:

- Bulls of 12 months and older must have nose-restraint.
- No Jr. Showman (10 or under as of Jan. 1, 2010) exhibiting Sr. division bulls.
- No bulls allowed for Showmanship. Only heifers will be exhibited In Showmanship.
- If an exhibitor doesn't receive the 25 points from the Bred & Owned heifer show, that exhibitor may receive those points when he/she exhibits his/her Bred & Owned bull.
